LEADERSHIP MESSAGE

In 2016, Heartlinks Hospice & Palliative Care provided end-of-life care and palliative care to 408 Benton and Yakima county patients and their families.

Heartlinks Hospice dedicated volunteers provided a record breaking total of 25,696 hours, the equivalent of 12 full-time employees, while maintaining performance standards that have far surpassed state and national benchmarks. We estimate that Heartlinks volunteers saved our agency \$579,451 in expense. In addition, stringent Medicare guidelines for participation were met, thereby securing 90.5% of our annual budget through this essential revenue stream.

Our community based palliative care program continues to grow as we strive to develop more resources for patients needing supportive care and pain and symptom management. We envision transferring the skills and expertise learned over almost four decades of hospice work to the growing population of patients living longer with advanced chronic illness.

We experienced an 8.9% increase over last year in charitable giving from memorials, grants and gifts, which totaled \$282,485.18. This support enables Heartlinks Hospice to keep its promise to provide expert guidance to all who need it, not just to those that can afford it.

Our successes in 2016 bring to mind Helen Keller's words, "Alone you can do so little; together we can do so much". At Heartlinks Hospice, we are deeply indebted to our family of patients, supporters, clinicians, staff, Guardian Angels, and volunteers who have made our work possible in the past, who continue to do so today, and who hold the vision of compassionate end-of-life care for our future.


