Dear Friends of Heartlinks,

This past year has been remarkable. We had the privilege of caring for 578 patients and their families - 457 in hospice and 121 in palliative care - resulting in 27,000 patient days of exceptional care and comfort. Our grief support programs have expanded to Prosser, Yakima, Grandview, two Sunnyside locations, and two Tri-Cities locations, offering solace and support to those in need.

Our Hospice Benefit Shops (Hobs) in Prosser and Zillah achieved record sales of more than \$400,000, thanks to our community's support and the hard work of our volunteers and staff. Volunteers contributed 5,860 hours, saving us \$196,250!

A highlight of 2023 was our successful push for increased reimbursement for pediatric palliative care, ensuring our youngest patients receive the specialized care they need. We're excited about opening the Heartlinks Adult Family Home, with our first residents expected in October 2024, underscoring our commitment to comprehensive care.

We welcomed two exceptional clinical managers: Emily Mobley, RN, in October 2022 and Cassandra Asmussen, RN, CHPN, in July 2023. Both bring experience and passion, driving improvements in our services.

In 2024, we are expanding partnerships and community outreach. We're committed to educating our community through presentations at local senior centers, skilled nursing facilities, assisted living homes, clinics, churches, and other groups. We're also launching a caregiver support group and seeking community members to help.

As we grow to meet our community's needs, our need for support also increases. No patient is ever turned away due to their ability to pay, and we rely on our Compassion Care program to cover costs that insurance doesn't. Your involvement and support make a significant difference.





Exciting changes have come to Heartlinks' Hospice Benefit Shop (Hobs) in Prosser! Thanks to the incredible support from our community, the shop now sports a vibrant new look. Grants from Historic Prosser Washington and Prosser United Good Neighbors allowed us to purchase paint, supplies, and a brandnew sign to refresh the façade of our beloved thrift shop on 5th Street.

In late April, volunteers from Grandview's Walmart Supply Chain Distribution Center #7021 rolled up their sleeves to paint the south and west exterior walls in a beautiful Historic Downtown Prosser color. Just days later, the talented artist Larelle Michener added a stunning ribbon mural with the phrase, "A boutique thrift shop to benefit Heartlinks." The finishing touch - a new sign - was installed on June 9th.

Every purchase made at our Prosser and Zillah thrift shops directly supports the Heartlinks Compassionate Care Fund. This fund ensures we can provide essential hospice, palliative, and grief care services to anyone in need, regardless of their financial situation.

Hobs has been a community fixture since 1998, founded by Jan Nilsson in honor of her mother-in-law, Anne O. Witcraft. In 2021, we expanded our reach by opening a second shop in Zillah. The revenue from both shops is vital in helping us serve children and adults in Benton and Yakima Counties with compassionate care.
