Last fall, I stood in the doorway of our newly opened Adult Family Home and watched as a daughter gently tucked a quilt around her mother's shoulders. In that quiet moment, I saw what Heartlinks is becoming—not just a provider of care, but a bridge between generations, between heartbreak and healing. That's the word that defines this year: **Bridges** 

In 2024, because of your trust and generosity, Heartlinks built two powerful new bridges, connecting more people to comfort, dignity, and expert care.

The Heartlinks Adult Family Home, which opened in October, filled immediately with life and love. We reached full capacity almost overnight, with a growing waitlist. This home has become more than a facility—it is a haven. Within its walls, some of life's most sacred chapters are closing with peace, purpose, and humanity. It is a bridge to our community's deepest compassion in action. One resident shared, "This house doesn't feel like a place to die—it feels like the first place I've been able to rest."



This year also marked the launch of Health Home—a program that completes the circle of care. Through Health Home, clients are paired with local Care Coordinators who walk beside them: setting goals, coordinating care, and connecting them to what matters most—housing, food, transportation, and emotional support. It's flexible,

free to the client, and deeply personal. Most of all, it puts people in control of their journey—with Heartlinks as a steady guide.

Our services continue to grow in reach and relevance. In 2024, our hospice program reached an average daily census of 84, with a record high of 107 patients in a single day. We supported more than 700 individuals through hospice and palliative care, and more than 1,000 through grief support.

None of these journeys would be possible without you—our donors, volunteers, partners, and families—whose care and commitment form the foundation of every bridge we build. Thank you for walking with us—brick by brick, heart by heart—as we build bridges of compassion that will carry our community for generations to come.

## Because Life is For Living

Linda\* became part of our Adult Family Home family soon after we opened our doors. When she arrived, she was living with advanced Alzheimer's disease and was nonverbal. At the time, she was receiving hospice care due to multiple severe wounds, pressure sores, and significant weight loss.

With compassionate, around-the-clock care, Linda made remarkable progress. Her wounds healed. Her strength returned. And for a time, she improved so much that she no longer met the criteria for hospice care.

Today, Linda is back on hospice—but not because of decline. She is resting peacefully, free of wounds or complications, and surrounded by familiar, loving caregivers. She spends her days quietly enjoying time with her family and the gentle rhythms of a home built for comfort, dignity, and presence.

Her journey reminds us that hospice is not just about the end of life—it's about living fully, with peace, in the time we have.


Heartlinks Adult Family Home opened October 1, 2024. At year-end, it housed five residents and employed 16 full- and part-time staff.






#### **Average Days on Hospice Care**
